EARLY SPRING REMINDERS

This newsletter is intended to be an early reminder of spring time activities as well as some advice on how to improve the neighborhood one house at a time. We have had a few cold weather days this winter so it is safe to say we have had a mild winter. As some of the warm weather has arrived early this year, the HOA would like to give an early reminder to the exterior maintenance that comes along with the warmer weather. The major area of regular concern in your community is the maintenance of the lawn areas. Home owners should be mowing, trimming, and cleaning up all lawn areas on a weekly basis from approximately March/ April until October/ November. The rest of the year should be addressed on an as needed basis. Lawn areas include, but are not limited to front, back and side lawns, planting beds, and tree swells. Edging along all hard surfaces like the driveway and/or roadways should also be included on a biweekly schedule. The clean up process of all these areas after each mowing should include removing clippings from the lawn, driveway and the street as needed as well as removing weeds from all planting beds, tree swells and mailbox posts. Allowing foreign weeds and grasses to remain in a planting bed is only promoting the establishment of the root system and making it more difficult to get rid of. Please be sure to also pull or kill and then remove any grass or weeds growing in the seams of your driveway. Not only does this help the appearance of the neighborhood, but if left to grow in the seams, grass and weeds can eventually crack the cement resulting in costly repairs. Lastly, all dead trees and plant materials should be removed and/or replaced. Landscaping is meant to be a compliment to your home and not a distraction. Allowing dead plants to remain do not create an appealing visual when potential buyers are visiting the community.

Routine mulch applications, as well as seed and fertilizer treatments can do wonders for your lawn. This is the most immediate task that needs to be completed by many homeowners. These three simple projects can be inexpensive and always worth the effort.
